Alzheimer's and Dementia Care Program

Thanks to the generosity of our donor community, the YRMC Foundation is providing funding for Year One of YRMC's new Alzheimer's and Dementia Care (ADC) Program. The ADC program helps patients and their families with the complex medical, behavioral and social needs of Alzheimer's disease and other types of dementia.

The program goals are 1) to maximize patient function, independence and dignity; 2) minimize caregiver strain and burnout, and 3) to reduce unnecessary cost through improved care. This is a much-needed and vastly important program for our community. Yavapai County ranks second among Arizona counties in the largest percentage (32%) of residents aged 65 and older. Most people diagnosed with dementia are in this same age demographic.

"The latest technology in the hands of experts who care."

This simple phrase truly describes YRMC's commitment to provide quality and compassionate care. And it's people like you who care who help sustain this legacy of service to our patients and their families.

Thanks to the many gifts received from our donor community, your YRMC Foundation was able to provide the funds needed to purchase eight next-generation diagnostic ultrasound systems for our Medical Center. Three Hologic MACH™ 30 ultrasound units, designed specifically for breast tissue imaging, were recently acquired for our Breast Care Center. And five Philips EPIQ Elite Diagnostic Systems

were acquired for our James Family Heart Center at YRMC.

“At nearly \$750,000, this is one of our Foundation’s largest funding initiatives,” said YRMC Foundation Executive Director, Robbie Nicol. “It’s humbling to know that each year, thousands of patients will benefit from the application this state-of-the-art technology made available through the kindness and generosity of others.”

Cognitive Assessment and Support Clinic

Hopefully you have seen the important community announcement regarding the opening of YRMC’s Cognitive Assessment and Support Clinic. The result of months of intensive planning and funded in part by the YRMC Foundation, the Clinic fills an important community need for our aging population.

The goal of the Clinic is to maintain frail older adults in our community at the most independent level possible. “In my work, I’ve found that as people



It was a special moment one afternoon when the YRMC Foundation’s Britney Smith was called to the Prescott hospital’s front lobby to meet with an unexpected guest and donor. Mr. Jensen shared he had a health condition several years ago that, while thankfully under control, has led to an array of serious medical issues over the last several years, and that the making of this jewelry has been, as he puts it, “therapy for my heart and soul.”

Since that initial gift, Mr. Jensen has continued to craft earrings for a few other departments that have touched his life in specific ways. “Paying it forward” to those

who do so much for their patients during difficult times brings Mr. Jensen purpose and joy.

Linda Leal and Sharon Welker – St. Luke’s Episcopal Church Angel Quilts



The YRMC Foundation received a call from Sharon Welker of the Angel Quilts quilting group at St. Luke’s Episcopal Church in Prescott. The group of 13 or so quilters regularly crafts beautiful handmade quilts for children with medical challenges, and Sharon (left) and her friend Linda Leal (right) reached out to us to see if the Family Birthing Center at YRMC would like to be a recipient. Sharon explains she had once led a similar program in Tucson and, as it happened, experienced quilter Linda had envisioned creating just such a program. It was a

match made in heaven . . . “meant to be,” as Linda says. In May 2019, Father Pierre-Henry at St. Luke’s asked if a quilt could be created urgently for a local family visiting their 18-month-old grandson scheduled for kidney surgery. Linda heeded the call and created the quilt for him in a mere four days.

Thanks to Angel Quilts’ strict guidelines on how fabrics must be sourced, handled and stored, the Foundation was thrilled to be able to accept several beautiful newborn-sized quilts on behalf of the Birthing Center, as well as a few larger quilts to provide to children in our Family Resource Center program and our pediatric ward. Linda and Sharon were equally happy to put some of their quilts to use here in our local community and get the word out about their work. We were very pleased to make this connection to provide cheer and comfort to our youngest and most vulnerable patients served by YRMC programs and facilities. As these talented ladies put it, “It’s a

funny thing...if you make a quilt for a kid, it keeps *you* warm. And whether we know them or not, they know there’s someone who cares.”



Dr. Ronael Eckman and Leigh Ann Frankel – Vaccination Center



Dr. Ronael Eckman, Chief Medical Information Officer at YRMC, was originally asked by YRMC leadership to plan the COVID-19 vaccination process for employees once the vaccine was available. She also began attending task force meetings with various community health services including Spectrum Healthcare, Northern Arizona Healthcare, and Yavapai County to formulate a plan for community vaccination. As the coronavirus rapidly intensified a few months later, it was clear YRMC needed to take a leading role in community vaccination as a primary Point of Distribution (POD). A vaccination center needed to be developed, and quickly. Collaboration was critical to pull together a venture of this magnitude. Working closely with YRMC Information Systems, Materials Management and Pharmacy leadership, in a mere six days Dr. Eckman and the POD team identified an ideal location: the large space at the Gateway Mall in Prescott formerly occupied by Sears.

In addition to several volunteers who had expressed interest in assisting with

the POD, Dr. Eckman needed a capable Volunteer Coordinator by her side. Enter Leigh Ann Frankel, an RN with 20 years of prior experience with YRMC's Emergency Department, ICU, and other roles. She saw her colleagues tirelessly working during the pandemic and wanted to give back by putting her skills and experience to work again. She was poised to accept a position with another employer, but upon hearing of this opportunity, decided to decline the paid position in favor of this volunteer role. As Leigh Ann puts it, "It just felt like the best decision for my community, and it turned out to be one of the best decisions I've ever made. It was incredibly powerful to be able to help so many people at once."

Volunteers needed to be contacted and scheduled, workflow and time studies

were needed to maximize efficiency, and appropriate physical distancing requirements needed to be met to ensure trust and safety. Seven days after securing the space, workflow and the Vaccination Center opened on January 21, 2021.

As a result of the team's efforts, an estimated 556 volunteers dedicated over 10,000 hours of time to the YRMC Vaccination Center, many of whom worked overtime well beyond their full-time jobs. Retired and active physicians and RN's, fire agencies, EMT's, and non-clinical community members came forward to offer their assistance. According to Dr. Eckman, "We couldn't have done it without our tremendous volunteers. They had great attitudes and really made themselves available. It was gratifying to see cooperation like this on such a scale."

What did these talented caregivers along with their team learn from the process? Dr. Eckman says it helped her reconnect with her core values and why she chose to become a physician. The collaboration made her proud of the medical industry – from vaccine development through production through distribution. Healthcare workers stood shoulder-to-shoulder, bolstering her faith in the medical profession. And Leigh Ann poignantly describes that no matter what family or other demands arose among the volunteer team during this time, there were always others who graciously stepped in to help carry the weight.

This dynamic duo also expressed their gratitude for the many YRMC Foundation donors who provided financial support during the operation of the YRMC Vaccination Center, covering expenses including lease fees, utilities, volunteer meals and refreshments, and other COVID-19 related expenses. This support helped create an efficient and pleasant environment for the volunteers as well as vaccine recipients, many of whom expressed their gratitude.

YRMC will continue our community vaccination efforts as we move into our next phase with the COVID-19 vaccine offered to all inpatients, Emergency Department patients, and scheduling for first and second doses at six Yavapai Regional Medical Group (YRMG) clinics, including the Pfizer vaccine for children aged 12–18 at Ponderosa Pediatrics.
