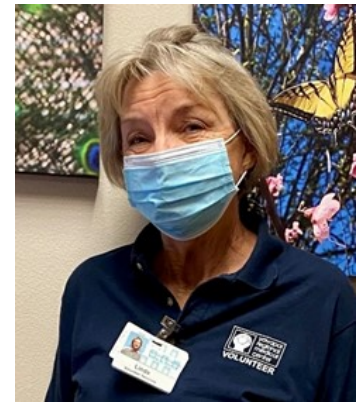
## Seasonal Volunteers

*Could be called, "feeling some sense of normalcy"*

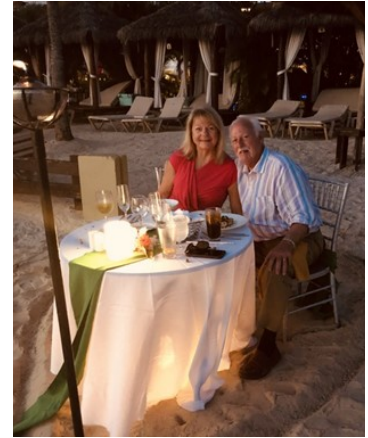
