YRMC's Volunteer Courtesy Cart program has been around for over 25 years, and is a very important part of YRMC's customer service. Between the two campuses, we have five carts with a team of dedicated cart drivers. On many occasions the Courtesy Cart drivers are the first faces many see when arriving or leaving YRMC.

Records of YRMC courtesy carts go back as far as 1993. The photos show the arrival of the hospital's first cart in the spring of 1993. Normally carts come fully assembled, however not this cart. It took YRMC Engineering staff countless hours to build the cart. After final assembly, Engineering had a few glitches that prevented the cart from running. Eventually these glitches were fixed and the cart was operational and ready for a steady stream of passengers. The invoice titled it as a "personnel carrier" which sounded a bit like a military vehicle rather than a golf cart!

The next time you see one of YRMC's courtesy cart drivers, give them a big "thank you" for volunteering in some of the worst weather conditions. Bad weather doesn't stop them, and their smiles prove it.
